



Board Election Results

Elections were held this July for five positions on the WREB Board of Directors.

Using a new online voting platform, DERB members elected two new at-large members: Dr. Dale Chamberlain (Montana) and Dr. Jeff Lunday (Oklahoma).

Dr. Chamberlain began examining for WREB in 2007. He has served as team captain for the last five years and has also been a member of the Endo Committee, serving as chair of that committee for one year.

In August, Dr. Lunday participated in his 80th dental exam with WREB. That's a lot of exams! Dr. Lunday has served on the dental appeals committee and is also a hygiene examiner.

DERB also elected a new treasurer, Dr. Greg Waite (Arizona). Dr. Waite has already served two years on the board as an at-large representative and will be replacing Dr. Arne Pihl whose term ends in December. Dr. Waite has been examining with WREB for eight years, two years of which has been as team captain.

Letter from Linda Paul



Thirty years ago in December 1984 I started working at WREB. I was the only full-time employee. There were three dental exams that year and 5 hygiene exams. WREB had four member states—Idaho had just joined. The member states of Arizona, Idaho, Montana and Utah did not have a dental school among them, so we tested at Loma Linda University and University of the Pacific in California. We had an annual budget of \$300,000. Committees were assigned to one person from each state. For example, the Board representative from Montana might be responsible for the Prosthetics Committee and any work that needed to be done for that part of the exam.

In 1984 there were four regional testing agencies. WREB was the youngest and smallest. However, in 1985 things started changing. Dr. David Low had just finished a two-year term as president of WREB and created a new position as Dental Exam Review Committee Chair. In that capacity he worked to make the committees more active and to continue enhancing the quality of the exam. Over the next ten years WREB made continued improvements in the examination administration for both dental and dental hygiene. The exams became consistent from site to site. In the early 1990s, we discovered the term “Psychometrics”, and began a long term effort to increase the reliability and validity of our examinations. When Texas and Oklahoma joined WREB in 1994, we doubled in size and hired additional staff. With the additions of Texas, Oklahoma, Oregon and California, we now had dental schools in member states where we could test. Other member states have now added new testing sites.

Now, in 2014, WREB is considered by many to be the premier dental clinical testing agency in the country. We have overcome several attempts to reduce our influence. We have survived and prospered and remained true to our mission. WREB currently has 20 member states, will offer 31 dental exams and 46 dental hygiene exams in 2015, and is accepted in over 35 states. I’ve enjoyed watching WREB grow and evolve.

The transition from the smallest and least influential testing agency to a nationally renowned organization has occurred because of the dedication of the members. Dr. Low had a vision to create a valid, reliable examination that treated candidates respectfully and welcomed qualified graduates into the profession. Many leaders, board members, committee members, examiners and staff have made that vision come to life through their efforts and dedication. It’s the people in WREB that distinguish WREB and make it the outstanding organization that it is. And it’s the people in WREB that kept me here for thirty years!

It has been an honor and a privilege to have worked with so many outstanding, dedicated individuals over the years. Thank you for allowing me to work with individuals with such a high level of integrity and dedication to creating a fair, professional examination.

New Director of Dental Exam Development—Dr. Jerri Donahue

Updates from July Board, HERB and DERB Meetings

This year's mid-year meetings for HERB, DERB and the WREB Board were held in Portland, Oregon.

Report from the Board

After presenting the election results, WREB CEO Beth Cole discussed WREB's financials, noting that the audit report for 2013 went smoothly and that year-over-year financials are on track. Beth also reported that PBIS, our sister company which conducts background investigations, had a 6% increase in applications from 2013, and 99% of applications are submitted online. PBIS' financials are also on track for the year.

Report from HERB

Next, Mary Davidson, RDH, reported on the meeting of the Hygiene Exam Review Board (HERB). The Anesthesia, Dental Hygiene and Restorative committees submitted, and HERB ap-

proved, several recommendations for implementation next year and the following year. Recommendations from each committee follow.

The Anesthesia Committee recommended that the assessment of sharps be separated into two categories: improper recapping and improper disposal. Candidates may improperly recap the needle early in the evaluation process. Currently, the program only allows recapping to be evaluated at the end of the exam. This is a critical error and failure and should be announced at the time the error occurs.

The Hygiene Committee made several recommendations:

- Remove the rejection penalty for submitting non-diagnostic radiographs.

Updates, continued

- Assess a maximum four (4) point penalty (per patient) for non-diagnostic radiographs/technique error.
- Only require additional films if a tooth in the submission is completely missing or if a re-take will provide additional information needed to assess a current oral condition(s).
- Allow a panoramic radiograph to be used as a substitute for a required periapical or bitewing.
- Decrease the final patient check in deadline by thirty (30) minutes. Exam statistics show this will have very little impact on candidates being able to submit an alternate or third patient.
- Clarify the descriptors for qualifying calculus.
- Keep the current criteria for qualifying calculus, removing the descriptor "heavy." Moderate deposits will not be added to the descriptors for qualifying deposits.
- Add ASA I-III to Patient Selection Criteria.
- Do not require candidates to submit an alternate with their first submission. Encourage them to do so, but allow them to submit a single submission without an alternate if they choose.

The Restorative Committee recommended the following items for 2016:

- Change grading criteria from a 0-5 grading scale to a 1-5 grading scale.
- Change the performance evaluation results to be reported to the candidate as a pass/fail instead of a point based score. An individual performance report would be included with an unsuccessful result.
- Revise the rescaling of final raw points earned from a percentage like number (0-100) to a criteria based number (1-5).

The HERB also passed a recommendation to ask the Hygiene, Anesthesia and Process of Care

committees to consider switching to pass/fail reporting on candidate reports as is done for Restorative.

The Board approved these recommendations.

Report from DERB

Following the report from HERB, Dr. Norman Magnuson reported on the meeting of the Dental Exam Review Board (DERB). Recommendations from each committee are below.

The Operative Committee recommended changing the current wrong material penalty from a 0.3 deduction to loss of all points for preparation grading and finish grading for the applicable procedure.

The Endontic Committee recommended a 0.3 deduction per tooth for undiagnostic x-rays at acceptance. The maximum deduction for undiagnostic x-rays is 0.6. They also recommended a 0.2 deduction per tooth at grading for undiagnostic x-rays.

The DERB also approved allowing dental students who are not in their final year of dental school to serve as assistants to candidates during the exam.

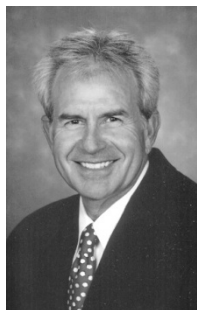
The Board approved these recommendations.

Report from WREB Psychometrician

Next on the agenda was WREB's in-house psychometrician, Sharon Osborn Popp, PhD, who presented a psychometric update. Candidate first-attempt pass rates and examiner agreement statistics remain consistent with prior years. The pattern of decreasing passing percentages with subsequent retakes remains consistent across all exams, except for DH Restorative where the pass rate for third attempts has almost doubled since the implementation of remediation after two unsuccessful attempts.

Sharon also indicated that practice analyses for Dental and Dental Hygiene will be completed in 2015 and 2016 respectively.

Dr. James Ence Appointed New DERB Chair



At the July meeting in Portland, Dr. Zayas appointed Dr. James Ence (Utah) to the position of DERB Chair, effective January 2015. He replaces Dr. Norm Magnuson who will begin his term as president-elect in January also.

Dr. Ence took the very first dental exam that WREB offered in 1977. For the past 28 years, Dr. Ence has practiced dentistry in St. George, Utah. In addition to dentistry, Dr. Ence's other pursuits include farming, fishing and serving on several local boards of directors.

For the past ten years, Dr. Ence has served as a WREB examiner in various capacities including dental grading examiner, dental team captain, endo floor examiner and dental floor examiner. He's even done a couple turns as an anesthesia flow examiner.

Dr. Ence is looking forward to his upcoming position as DERB Chair and had this to say about it, "I hope to play a part in seeing that the exams are designed and administered in such a way that continues to be fair and equitable for the candidates, test them on procedures that they have been taught and will practice, and still protect the integrity of the exam process and the good name of the WREB organization."

Dr. James Cole Awarded the David S. Low Service Award

At the DERB meeting in July in Portland, OR, Dr. James Cole received the Davis S. Low Service Award. WREB Board President Dr. Joe Zayas presented the award to Dr. Cole.

Dr. Cole joined WREB in 1988 and became friends with Dr. Low at his first exam that same year. Since then, Dr. Cole has served in many roles, including chief examiner, president (2 terms), committee member (numerous) and head of CSW.

During his tenure as WREB president in 1994, Dr. Cole and Dr. Low recruited three new states—Oklahoma, Texas and Washington—doubling WREB's finances and the number of candidates taking WREB exams. Dr. Cole has not only witnessed tremendous growth and change during his time with WREB but was instrumental in shaping WREB into the organization it has become today.

During his acceptance speech, Dr. Cole referred to Dr. Low as WREB's foremost leader. "I'm humbled and honored that you've chosen to give this award to me," said Dr. Cole. He concluded by saying, "Of all the organizations I've belonged to, WREB is the best!"

Coming in 2015—Onsite Dental Hygiene Exam Retakes

The 2015 exam season includes some exciting changes to the dental hygiene exam. Dental hygiene onsite exam retakes will be offered to qualifying candidates. Candidates must meet 2015 retake eligibility requirements. WREB will be the first to offer candidates this convenient opportunity.

Dental hygiene exam retakes will occur at the end of the normal exam schedule. For normal attempts and retake attempts, Candidates are notified onsite as to whether they've passed the exam.

Dental Hygiene Process of Care Exam

Beginning in 2015, the Process of Care exam will no longer be required for dental hygiene candidates.

Meet Another Dental Hygiene Coordinator



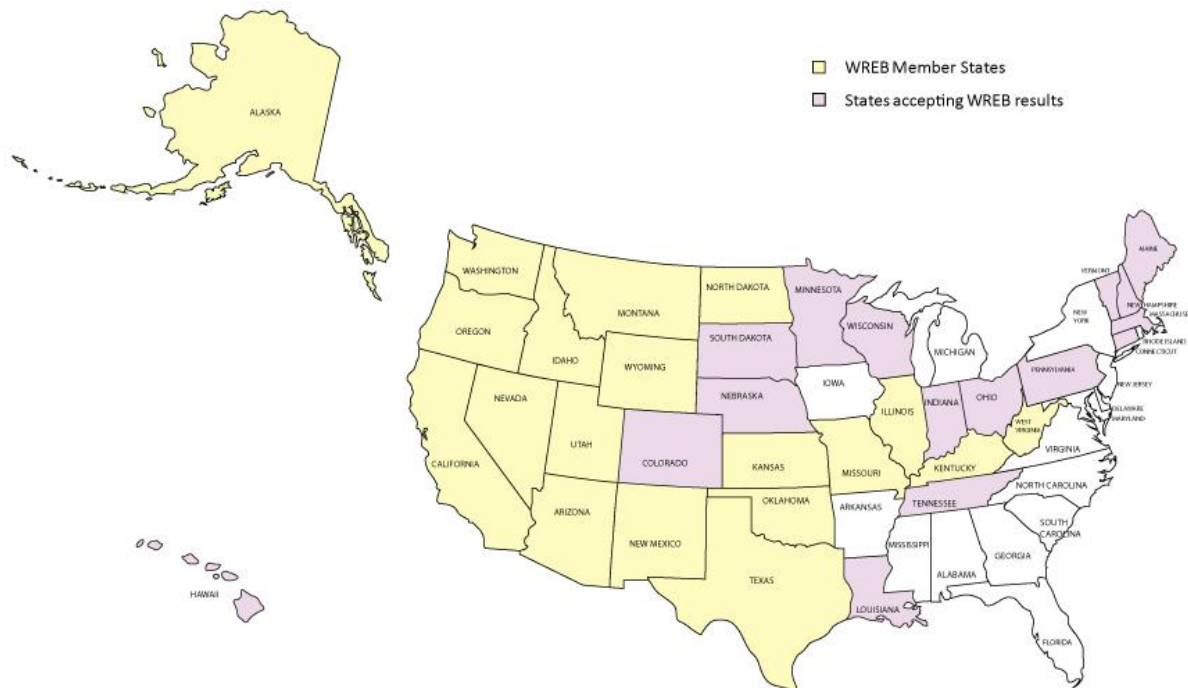
